



School Value

91% vs. 68%

At 91 percent, the majority of public middle school students felt that school is valued within their families. In <u>public high school</u>, only 68 percent reported that school is valued within their families.

Motivation

95% vs. 65%

In public middle schools, 95 percent of students reported that they are motivated to get their education—the same percent as students in private high schools who are preparing for college. In <u>public high school</u>, however, 65 percent of students said they were motivated to get their education.

Safety

80% vs. 41%

80 percent of private high school students report feeling safe at school—almost double that of 41 percent of <u>public high school</u> students.

Technology

25% vs. 77%

In today's technology-driven world, 25 percent of students in <u>public high schools</u> reported that computers are available for every student when classes use the lab as opposed to 77 percent of their private school counterparts.
